
### What does Phacops mean?

Phacops is a species of trilobite. The word Phacops means "many eyes" in Latin.

### What is a Trilobite?



The word trilobite comes from the Greek word treislobos, meaning three lobed one. The three lobes of a trilobite run parallel to the axis of the body. These three lobed arthropods of the ancient seas are now extinct but we can still learn about them from fossil records found around the world. Some trilobites were burrowing trilobites, while others could swim and crawl. All trilobites were scavengers of the ancient seas who ate mud, seaweed, and algae for food. The segmented exoskeleton allowed the trilobite to roll up into a ball to protect its soft underside from predators. A pair of jointed legs attached to each body segment, allowed the trilobite easy mobility on a soft muddy sea floor.

Tom Johnson's passion for collecting fossils began as a child on the shores of Lake Erie, he frequented the quarries of Southern Michigan while growing up, and as a young adult moved to Ohio in search of the notorious Isotelus trilobite. Tom excavated at Caesar Creek spillway for four years while working on a study-project for the Smithsonian Institution. His finds from the project are on exhibit in the National Museum and at the Caesar Creek Visitor's Center in Warren County, Ohio.

Tom has collected trilobites from all over the world, has participant in many Gem, Mineral and Fossil Shows annually and nationwide and continues to search for Ohio's largest trilobite. Tom's goal is to break his own record for Ohio's largest trilobite find. Come see his Current collection housed at the House of Phacops.
